Technical data:

The torques for operating multileaf dampers must be dimensioned in such a way that the damper can be safely opened and closed. For closure, the torque must suffice to ensure complete shut-off by the blades.

Opening is initiated without the impact of aerodynamic forces.

When air flows through the damper, the aerodynamic forces of the airflow create a closing force (torque) on the blades; this happens independent of the direction of the airflow.

This closing force must be countered, or overcome.

The blade angle a with the largest torque depends, among other things, on the fan characteristics.

Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Energy, water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on EPDs according to EN 15804 and different LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.


